### About BCMS

Welcome to the Building Control Management System (BCMS). A Commencement Notice is required to give notice to Building Control Authorities of the erection of buildings, or classes of buildings, or the carrying out of works, or classes of works, as may be specified in the regulations. A building or works may also require a Fire Safety Certificate Application, a Disability Access Certificate Application and/or a Certificate of Compliance on Completion. For specific works or buildings an application for a Dispensation from or a Relaxation of a requirement to the building regulations may be appropriate. Each Owner, Designer, Builder and Approved Certifier must first register/sign up with the BCMS to make a submission or accept a role. S.I. 9 of 2014 recommends this BCMS site as the preferred means of electronic building control administration.

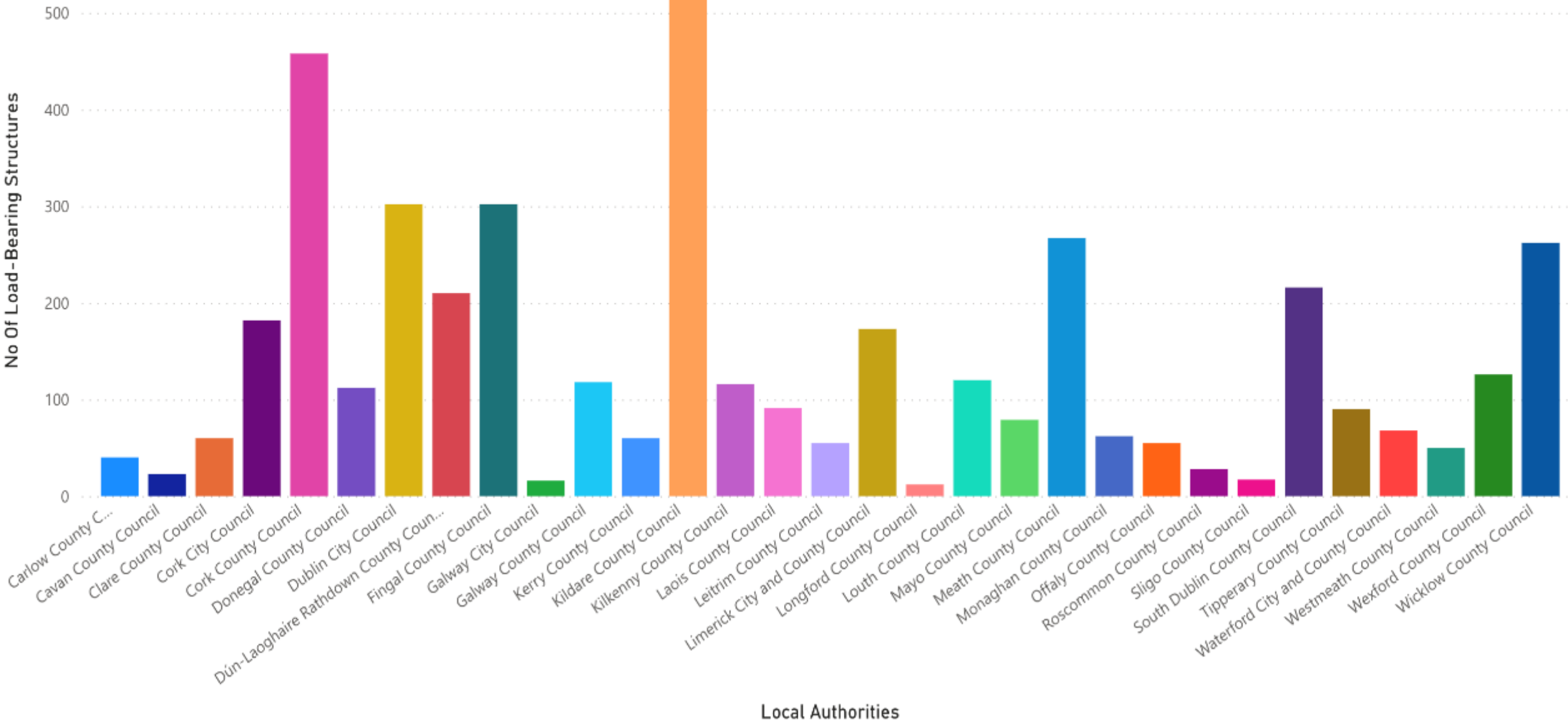






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## LOAD-BEARING STRUCTURES PRE-FABRICATED OFF-SITE BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES FOR 2022

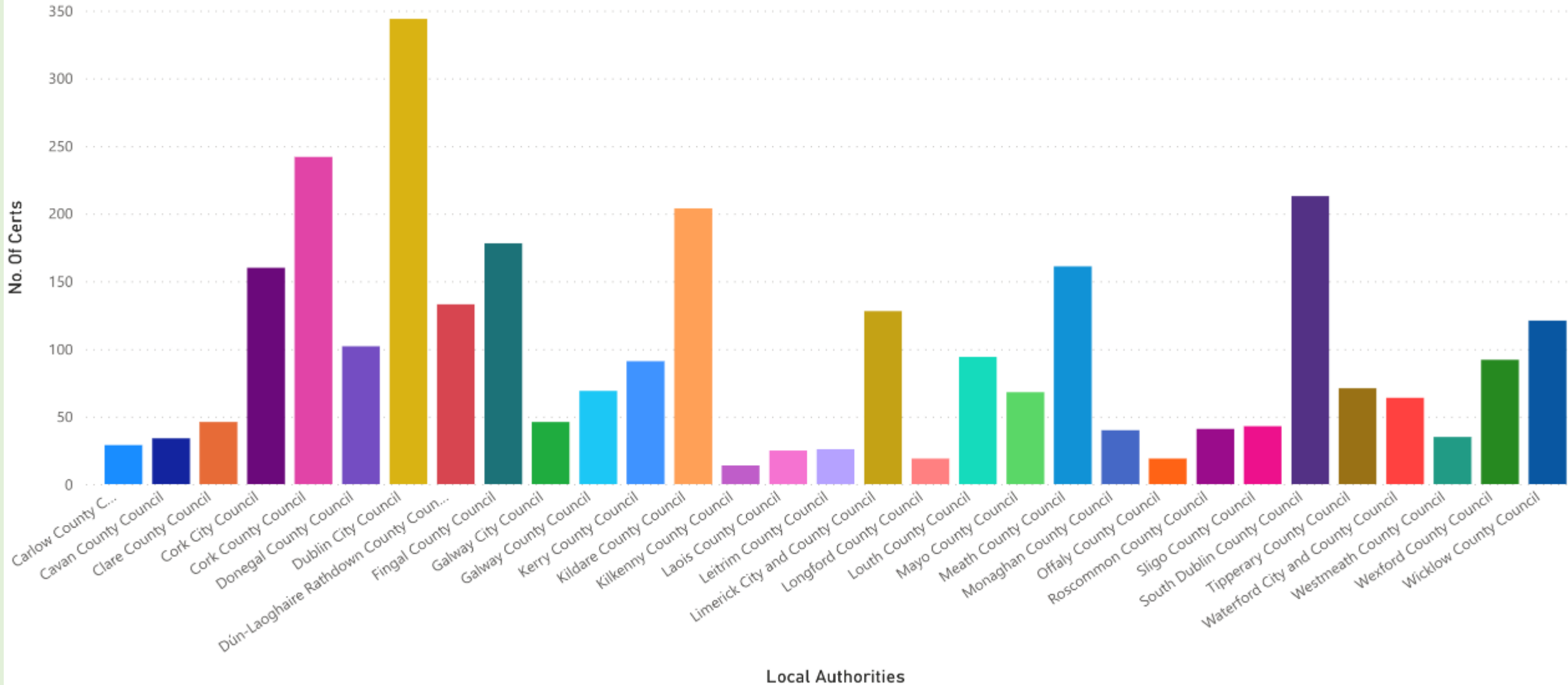

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TOTAL NUMBER OF FIRE SAFETY CERTS FOR 2022



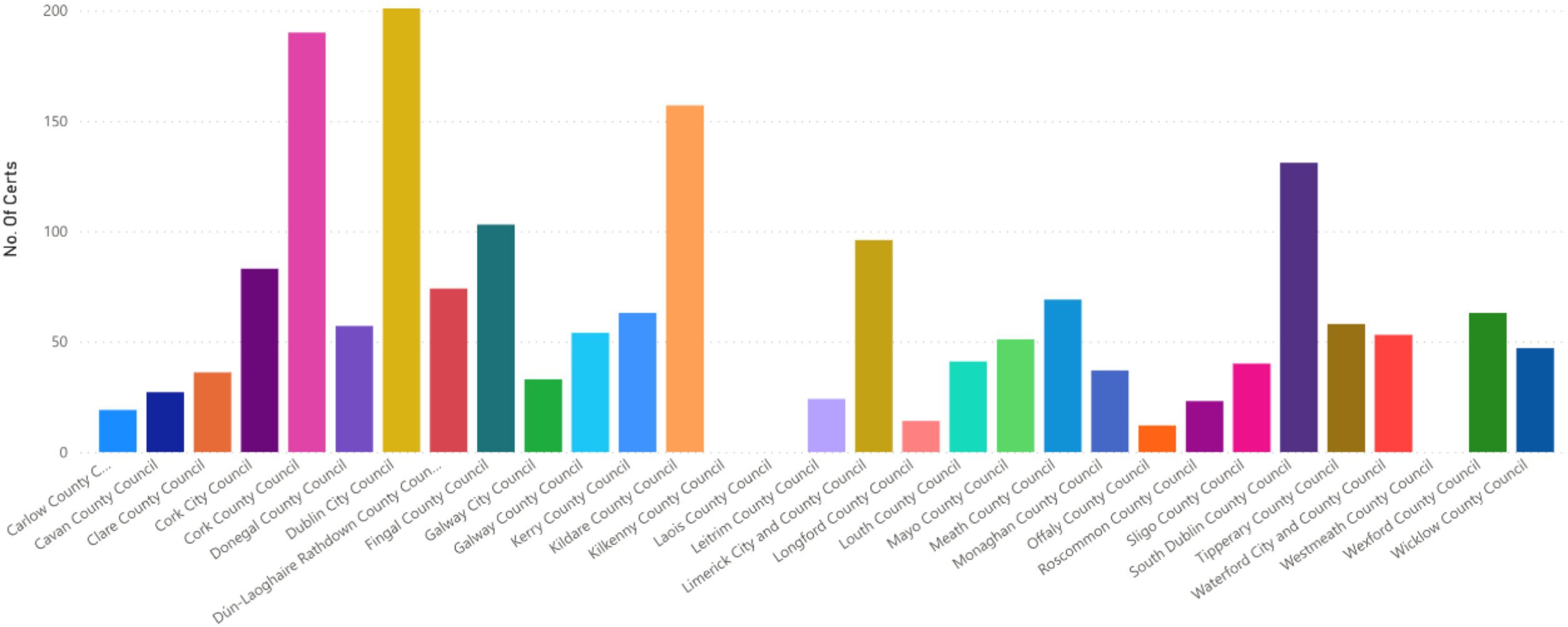

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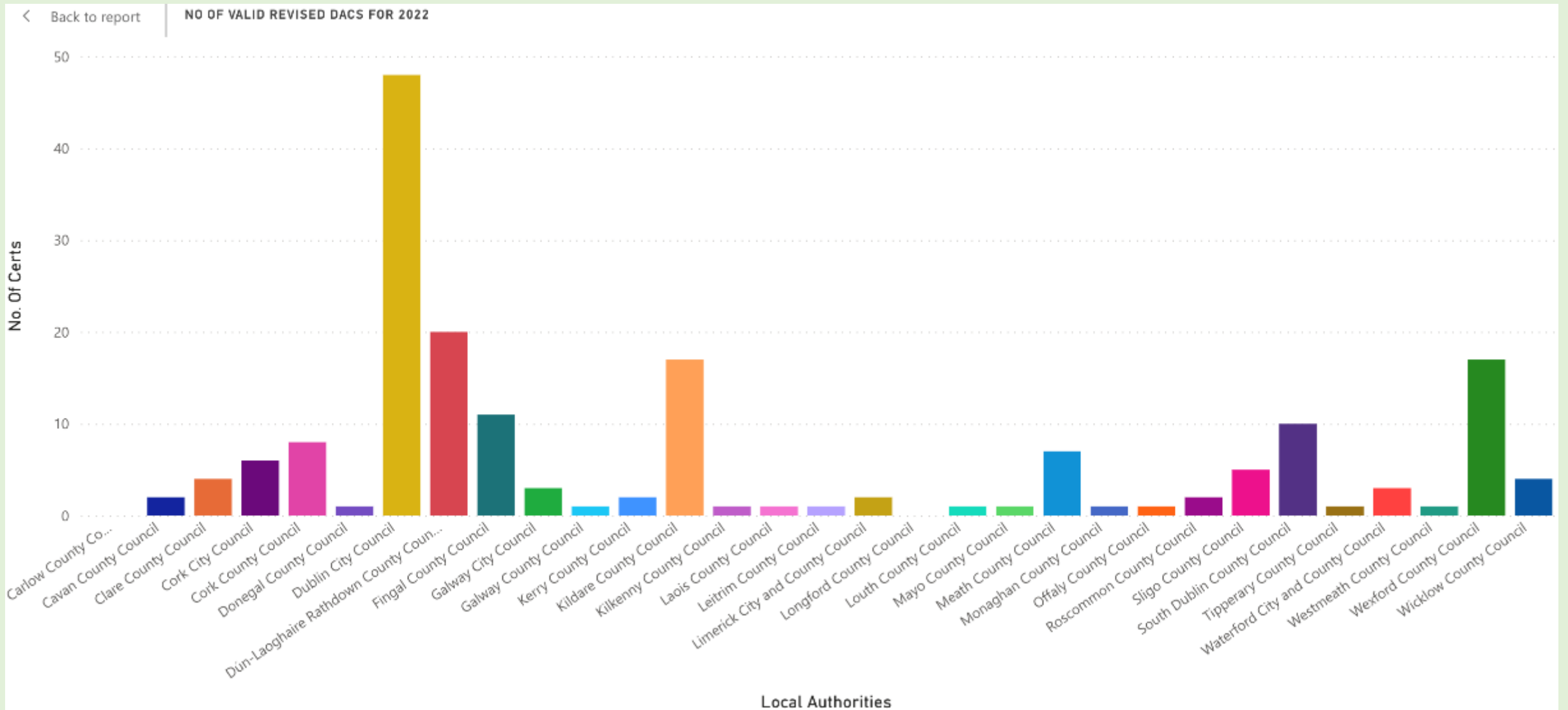

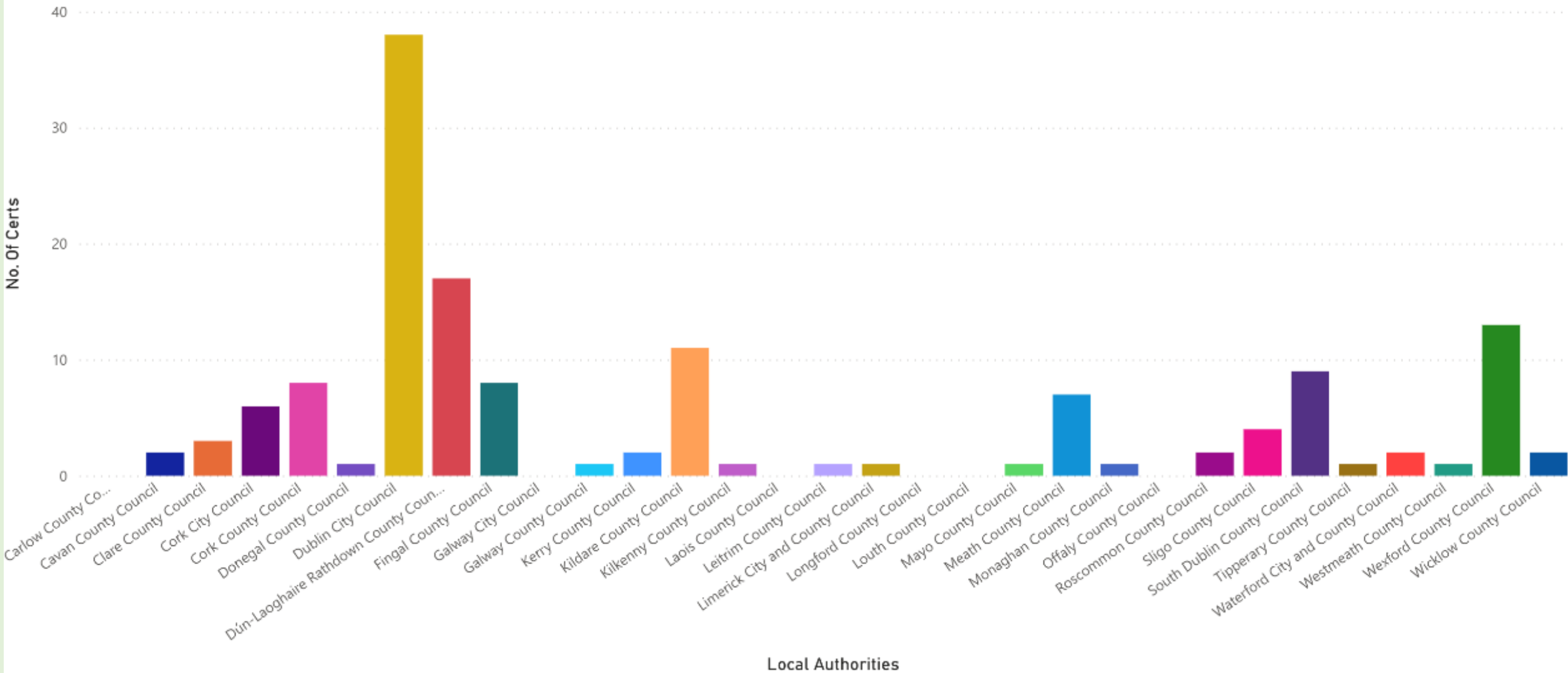

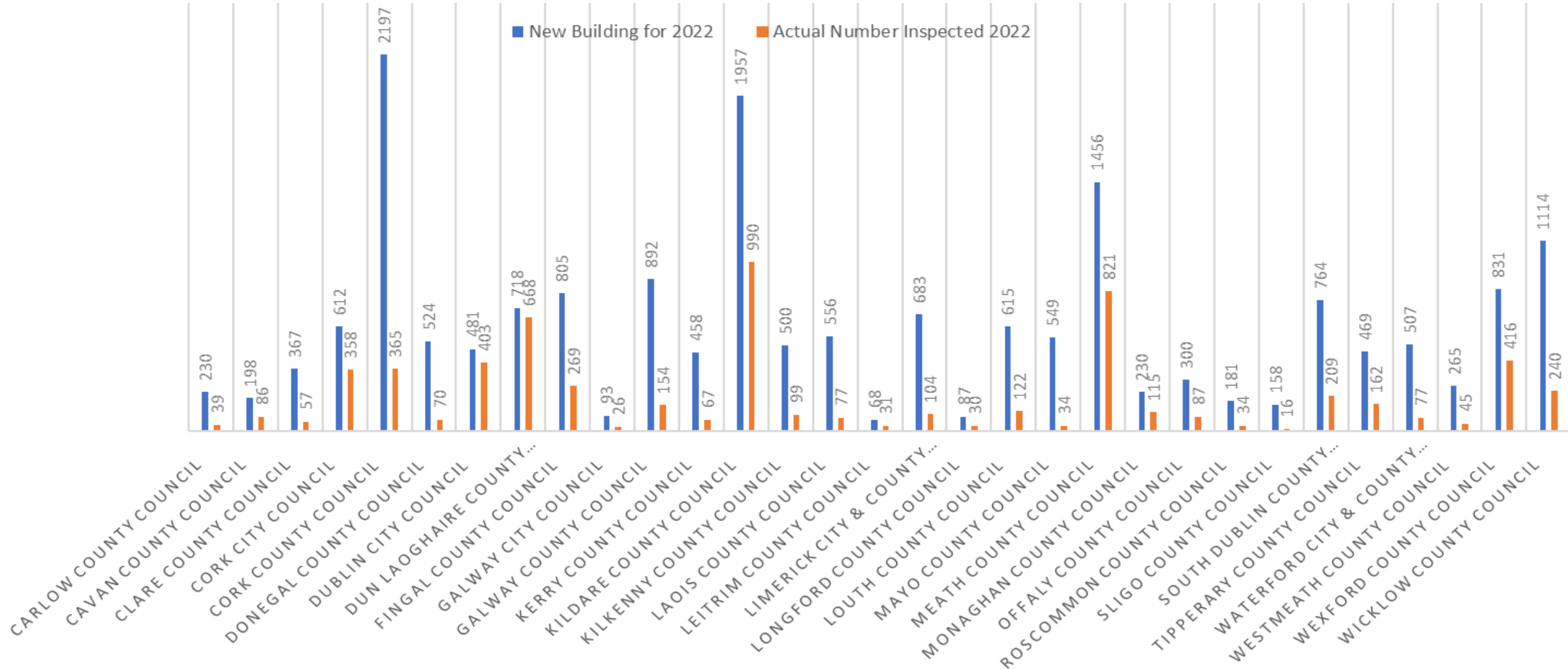

## £42 million to support delivery of building safety reforms

Government announces funding to support recruitment and training of Building Control Inspectors and Fire Inspectors working with the Building Safety Regulator

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More than £42 million over the next three years will support the delivery of tough new standards for managing building safety for higher-risk buildings brought in by the landmark Building Safety Act, the Government has announced today.

*The package consists of a £16.5m grant to Local Authority Building Control (LABC), the representative body for local authority building control in England and Wales, and £26m to support the Fire and Rescue Services in England and the National Fire Chiefs Council.*

*The grant funding will enable local regulators to recruit, train and employ new Building Control Inspectors and Fire Inspectors. These local partners will support the work of the new Building Safety Regulator in overseeing the safety and standards of the design, construction and management of higher-risk buildings, as well as strengthening the sector as a whole.*

## European Union (Planning and Development) (Displaced Persons from Ukraine Temporary Protection) Regulations 2022

Minister O'Brien has signed the European Union (Planning and Development) (Displaced Persons from Ukraine Temporary Protection) Regulations 2022 (S.I. 306 of 2022).

The regulations, which came into effect on 23 June 2022, provide that certain classes of temporary development, including residential accommodation, undertaken by or on behalf of a State authority, to provide protection to displaced persons from Ukraine, will be exempt from the provisions of the Planning and Development Act (other than environmental considerations).

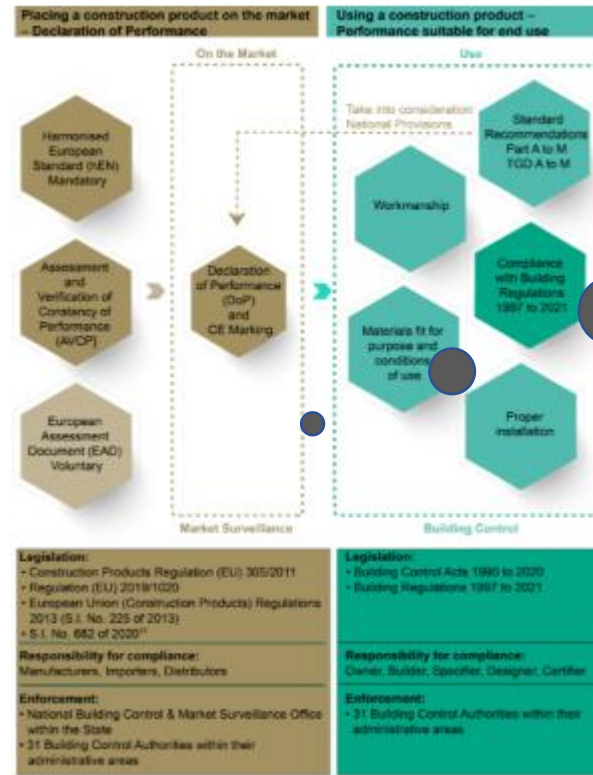

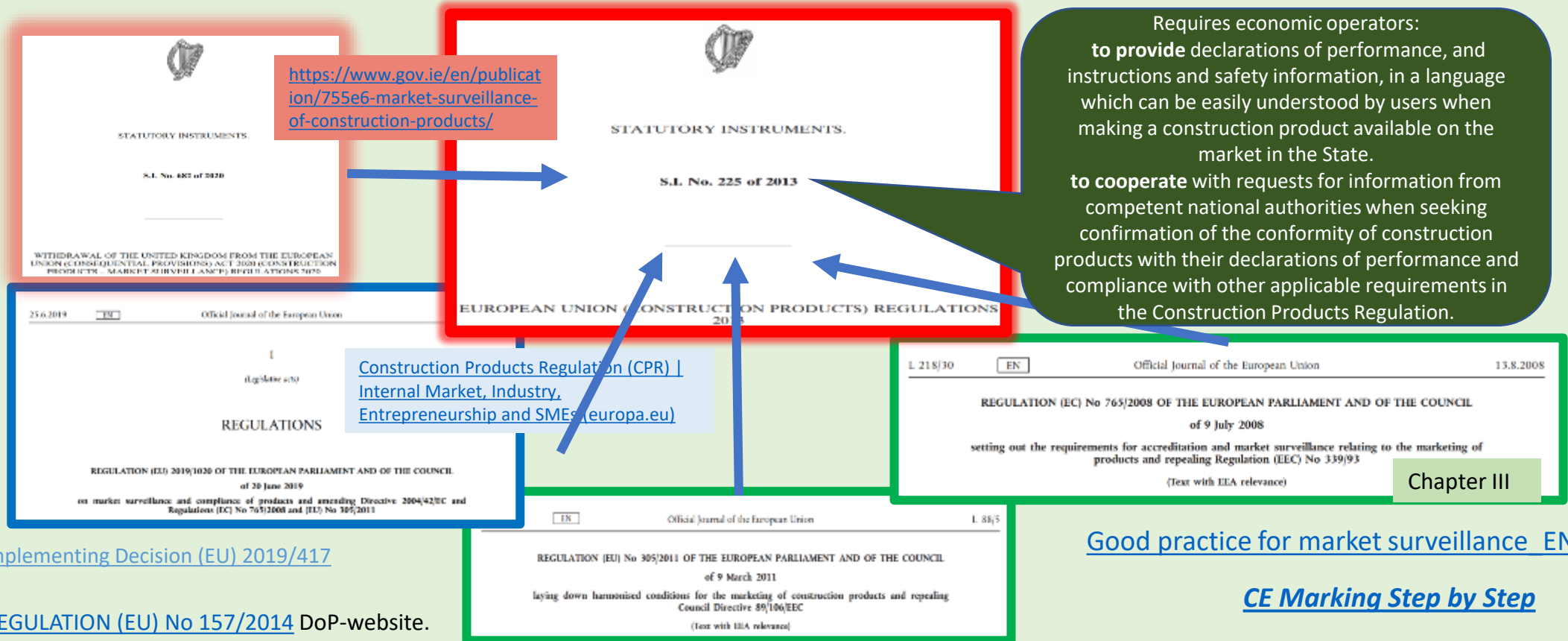

# Construction Products Regulation & Market Surveillance and Compliance of Products

[The “[Construction Products Regulation](#)”

[EU 305 of 2011](#), prescribes **BASIC REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSTRUCTION WORKS** i.e.,

*Construction works as a whole and in their separate parts must be fit for their intended use, considering in particular the health and safety of persons involved throughout the life cycle of the works. Subject to normal maintenance, construction works must satisfy these basic requirements for construction works for an economically reasonable working life.”]*

*‘essential characteristics’ means those characteristics of the construction product which relate to the basic requirements for construction works;*

# REGULATION (EU) No 305/2011



- ***The primary purpose of the Construction Products Regulation is to break down technical barriers to trade to ensure the free movement of construction products across Member States within the European Union***



## REGULATION (EU) 2019/1020- Article 11-Activities of Market Surveillance Authorities

Market surveillance authorities, **shall perform** appropriate checks on the characteristics of products on an adequate scale, by **means of documentary** checks and, where appropriate, **physical and laboratory checks** based on adequate samples, **prioritising their resources and actions to ensure effective market surveillance** and taking into account the **national market surveillance strategy** referred to in Article 13.

In deciding on which checks to perform, on which types of products and on what **scale**, market surveillance authorities shall follow a **risk-based approach** taking into account the following factors:

- (a) possible **hazards and non-compliance** associated with the products and, where available, their occurrence on the market;
- (b) **activities and operations under the control** of the economic operator;
- (c) the **economic operator's past record** of non-compliance;
- (d) if relevant, the **risk profiling** performed by the authorities designated under Article 25(1);
- (e) **consumer complaints** and other information received from other authorities, economic operators, media and other sources that might indicate non-compliance.





## Market Surveillance Appointment of Authorised Officers S.I. No. 225 of 2013



- 11 (a) a **Building Control Authority** shall appoint officers to be authorised officers for the purpose of these Regulations,
- (b) a **Competent Authority** appointed by the Minister pursuant to Regulation 10(1)(b) shall appoint officers to be authorised officers for the purpose of these Regulations, or
- (c) a **competent person** appointed by the Minister pursuant to Regulation 10(1)(c) shall be an authorised officer for the purpose of these Regulations.
- (2) An authorised officer **shall be furnished with a warrant of his appointment** as an authorised officer and, when exercising any power conferred on him by these Regulations, shall, if requested by any person affected, produce the warrant to that person.”

*A Market Surveillance Authority may also encourage compliance by providing information on applicable legislation (e.g., via press releases, dedicated websites, or information campaigns) at any stage of the design and production process and carry out checks at trade shows fairs and exhibitions*



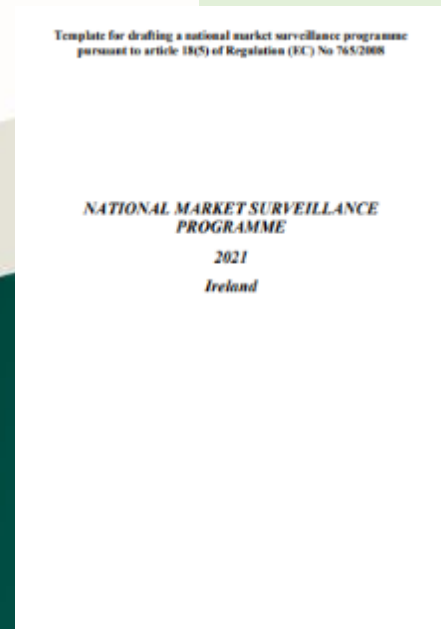
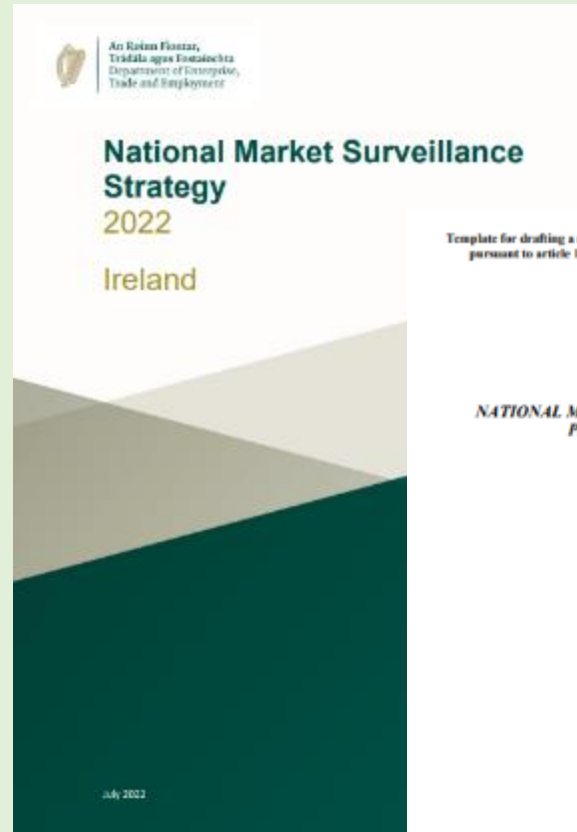

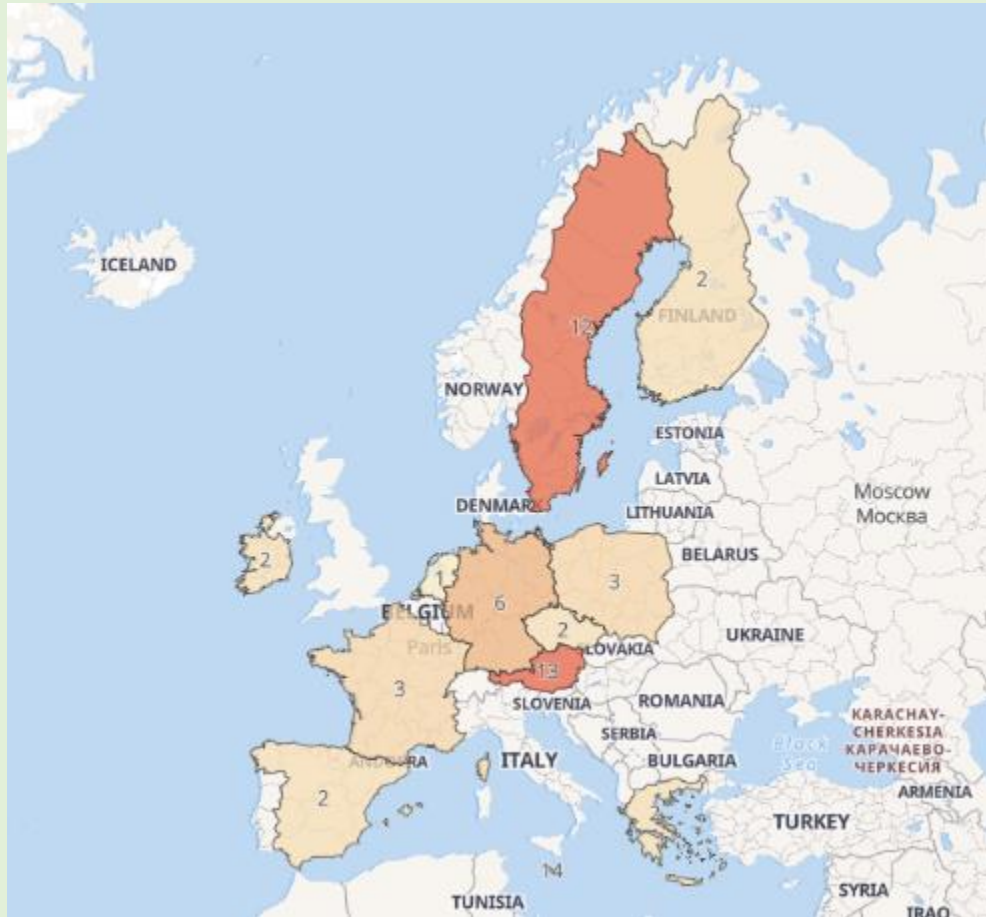
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## Market Surveillance – Promoting Compliance

#### CHAPTER VI

#### CROSS-BORDER MUTUAL ASSISTANCE

##### Article 22

##### Mutual Assistance

1. There shall be efficient cooperation and exchange of information among the market surveillance authorities of the Member States, and between market surveillance authorities and the Commission and the relevant Union agencies.
2. When a market surveillance authority is unable to conclude its investigation because of its inability to access certain information, despite having made all appropriate efforts to obtain that information, it may submit a reasoned request to the market surveillance authority of another Member State where access to this information can be enforced. In this case the requested authority shall supply to the applicant authority without delay, and in any event within 30 days, any information that the requested authority

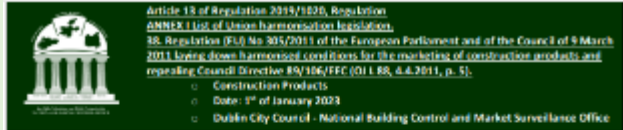

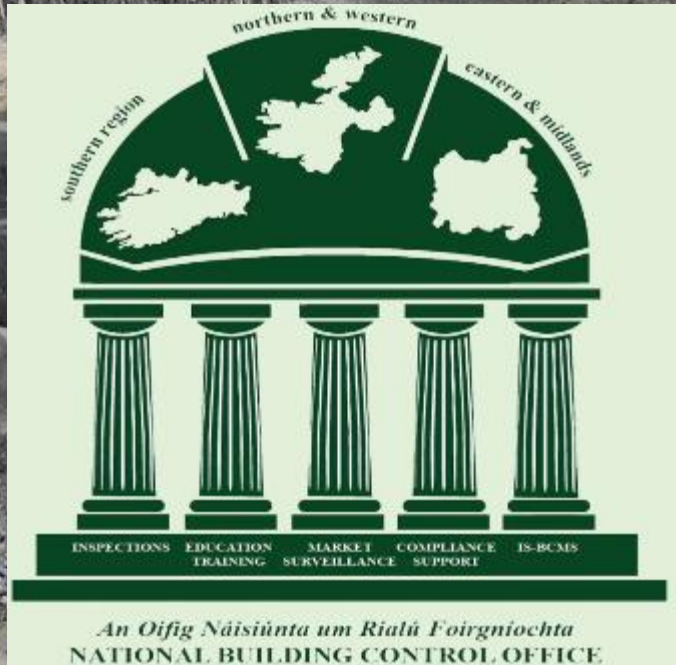
